RECOMMENDATION:

- Reject the Big Bend Transit, Inc. proposal submitted in response to Request for Proposals No. 2021-01 that was received at the office of the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council after 3:00 p.m., Eastern Standard Time, January 7, 2022.
- Reject the Maruti Mobility Management, Inc. proposal as being nonresponsive to Request for Proposals 2021-01.
- Authorize the Executive Director to re-advertise Request for Proposals No. 2021-01 for the • designation of the Community Transportation Coordinator for Madison County.

BACKGROUND:

The Council issued Request for Proposals No. 2021-01 for the Madison County Community Transportation Coordinator designation on November 5, 2021. The following firms submitted proposals in response to the request for proposals: Big Bend Transit, Inc. and Maruti Mobility Management.

The Big Bend Transit, Inc. proposal was received at the office of the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council after 3:00 p.m., Eastern Standard Time, January 7, 2022. Thus, it is recommended that the Big Bend Transit, Inc. proposal be rejected as being nonresponsive to Request for Proposals No. 2021-01.

As required by Rule 41-2.010 (4)(c) of the Florida Administrative Code, Request for Proposals No. 2021-01 specified that proposals must include a current audited financial statement prepared by a licensed independent certified public accountant that clearly shows that the proposer is financially capable of successfully performing the contract. Request for Proposals No. 2021-01 further specified that proposals without a current financial statement prepared by a licensed certified public accountant would be rejected without further consideration.

The Maruti Mobility Management, Inc. proposal did not include a current financial statement prepared by a licensed certified public accountant. Thus, it is recommended that the Maruti Mobility Management, Inc. proposal be rejected as being nonresponsive to Request for Proposals No. 2021-01.

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Resolution Supporting Creation of a Statewide Coordinated Planning SUBJECT: and Prioritization Approach for Water Resource Investments Modeled on the Florida Transportation Commission

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt attached Resolution No. 2022-01 Supporting Creation of a Statewide Coordinated Planning and Prioritization Approach for Water Resource Investments Modeled on the Florida Transportation Commission.

BACKGROUND:

Florida needs a more effective comprehensive framework for coordinating and prioritizing funding for local water projects to address challenges such as but not limited to: algal blooms, water conservation, marine resources/habitat/coral reef protection, water quality protection, minimum flows and levels, stormwater management, and climate change adaptation and resiliency. Local governments need a framework for improving coordination and prioritization of funding for local and regional water projects similar to the organizational structure of the Florida Department of Transportation, which has proven successful for transportation planning.

The Department includes a Transportation Commission whose mission is to provide leadership in meeting Florida's transportation needs through policy guidance on issues of statewide importance and by maintaining oversight, public accountability to the Department, and other statutorily specified transportation authorities. The Florida Transportation Commission was created in 1987, under Section 20.23, Florida Statutes, to serve as a citizen oversight board for the Department. The Commission is assigned to the Department for administrative and fiscal purposes; otherwise, it functions independently of the control and direction of the Department. Additionally, the Florida Transportation Plan, under Section 339.155, Florida Statutes, provides the framework for the development of the state long-range transportation goals and objectives to be updated every five years.

The Water and Environmental Sustainability Committee of the Florida Association of Counties recently proposed modeling state water resource investment on the Florida Transportation Commission and Florida Transportation Plan approach for planning, prioritization, a predictable multi-year capital construction program and oversight which reliably delivers transportation improvements.

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RESOLUTION NO. 2022-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE NORTH CENTRAL FLORIDA REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL SUPPORTING CREATION OF A STATEWIDE COORDINATED PLANNING AND PRIORITIZATION APPROACH FOR WATER RESOURCE INVESTMENTS MODELLED ON THE FLORIDA TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council is a multipurpose regional governmental entity with policy responsibility in the areas of affordable housing, economic development, emergency preparedness, natural resources and regional transportation; and

WHEREAS, the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council's geographical area is comprised of Alachua, Bradford, Columbia, Dixie, Gilchrist, Hamilton, Lafayette, Levy, Madison, Suwannee, Taylor and Union Counties and the 40 municipalities contained therein and home to over one-half million people; and

WHEREAS, the coastal marshes, rivers, lakes, wetlands and aquifers of the Region are identified as Natural Resources of Regional Significance in the Council's Strategic Regional Policy Plan; and

WHEREAS, significant challenges face Florida in meeting the need for drinking water while also treating our sewage and protecting the environment; and

WHEREAS, a significant roadblock to effectively addressing the water challenges facing Florida is the fractured nature of responsibility for water and the uncoordinated investment of funds to meet our needs; and

WHEREAS, funding at the state level has been subject to shifting legislative priorities and local perspectives rather than a strategic approach, leading to inefficiencies and a growing backlog of needed infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, recognizing this situation, the Water and Environmental Sustainability Committee of the Florida Association of Counties recently proposed modeling state water resource investment on the Florida Transportation Commission and Florida Transportation Plan approach for planning, prioritization, a predictable multi-year capital construction program and oversight which reliably delivers transportation improvements; and WHEREAS, coordinated and efficient investment of sufficient state funding for regional systems in concert with local funding of local systems is needed in order to meet water needs and protect water resources and the environment now and into the future.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the North Central Florida Regional Planning Council that:

Section 1. The above recitals are declared to be true and correct and are hereby made a part of this resolution.

Section 2. The Council expresses its support for statutory changes that will lead to coordinated and strategic investment of state funds for water resources using a structure modeled on the Florida Transportation Commission and Florida Transportation Plan.

Section 3. A copy of this resolution shall be transmitted to the Governor, the President of the Florida Senate, the Speaker of the Florida House of Representatives, the Florida Association of Counties, the Florida League of Cities and all regional planning councils in Florida.

Section 4. This resolution shall be effective upon adoption.
