SUBJECT: Amendment to Memorandum of Agreement with Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council

Concerning Regional Economic Modeling, Inc.

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the Executive Director to sign an amendment to the memorandum of agreement with Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council for an additional year as a user of the Regional Economic Modeling, Inc., for a fixed fee amount of \$5,530.50.

BACKGROUND:

In 2005, the Council entered into a memorandum of agreement with the Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council to be a user of the Regional Economic Modeling, Inc. economic impact model. The Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council is a licensed user of the model by Regional Economic Modeling, Inc. The Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council is authorized to issue user rights to other parties subject to collection of a fee to be paid to Regional Economic Modeling, Inc. At this time, Tampa Bay Regional Planning Council is proposing to extend the Council's existing memorandum of agreement for a one-year period for a fixed fee of \$5,530.50.

The Regional Economic Modeling, Inc. model is based upon an input-output engine and provides the Council, our local governments, economic development agencies and others with a dynamic tool for economic and demographic analysis and forecasting. It uses national data calibrated for the region, but also can accept local data sets to enhance its accuracy. This model can review system-wide effects over both short- and long-range time horizons, include economic and fiscal impact analyses, policy impact analyses and economic development/redevelopment analyses. The model can be configured to either address the entire region of any number of county-based subsets of the region, as well as including counties in adjacent regions.

Council staff has used this model to evaluate the impact of several projects throughout the region. Examples of projects include an advertising agency in Alachua County, a hotel and a redevelopment project in the City of Gainesville, a sanitary sewer system in the City of Archer, a recreational vehicle resort in the City of Hawthorne, a food processing plant in the City of Newberry, a computer technical support call center, manufacturing facilities and sports complex in Columbia County, a hypothetical manufacturing plant in Gilchrist County, an ethanol plant in Hamilton County, a refrigerated container manufacturing plant in Madison County, a manufacturing facility and a sawmill plant in Suwannee County and an electric power generating plant in Taylor County.



- The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council authorizes the Chair to sign any and all assurances, agreements or contracts which are required in connection with the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund Grant Program;
- 5. The North Central Florida Regional Planning Council authorizes its Executive Director to sign the planning grant application form, any and all reimbursement invoices, warranties, certifications and other documents which may be required in connection with the agreement or subsequent agreements; and
- 6. This resolution shall be effective upon adoption.

SUBJECT: Amendment to Fixed Asset Threshold

RECOMMENDATION:

Increase the minimum value of fixed assets from \$1,000 to \$5,000 for all Council property.

BACKGROUND:

Currently, the Council classifies equipment, fixtures, and other tangible personal property of a nonconsumable and nonexpendable nature with a value or cost which is \$1,000 or more and the normal expected life of which is one year or more as a fixed asset.

The executive director or his designee, as custodian of such property, maintains a record of such property. Once each year, the custodian takes an inventory of property, compares it to the property record and traces and reconciles all discrepancies.

On July 1, 2020, the Florida Department of Financial Services, Division of Accounting and Auditing, amended Florida Administrative Code, Chapter 69I-72.002 State-owned Tangible Personal Property, to increase the minimum value threshold for recording property as fixed assets from \$1,000 to \$5,000 for state agencies. On October 1, 2020, the Florida Department of Financial Services, Division of Accounting and Auditing, amended Florida Administrative Code, Chapter 69I-73.002 Tangible Personal Property Owned by Local Governments, to increase the minimum value threshold for recording property as fixed assets from \$1,000 to \$5,000 for local governments. Based upon this action and the increased cost of equipment, fixtures and other tangible personal property, it is recommended that the Council also increase the minimum value of fixed assets from \$1,000 to \$5,000 for all Council property.

Amendments to Purchasing Procedures

RECOMMENDATION:

Amend the dollar limits established by the Council for purchasing as indicated in the attached Property, Budget and Fiscal Control Procedures and Policies document, dated February 24, 2022.

BACKGROUND:

Based upon Florida Statutes, Section 287.017, Purchasing Categories, Threshold Amounts, it is recommended that the dollar limits of the various categories of purchasing be amended as stated in the attached Property, Budget and Fiscal Control Procedures and Policies document, dated February 24, 2022. These amendments in thresholds will result in the purchasing procedures of the Council being more efficient.

In addition to the limits that are established by the Council to guide purchasing, written administrative procedures are also in place to follow when seeking proposals for securing consultant services consistent with Florida Statutes, Section 287.55, Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act.

The limits recommended are adequate and protect the financial interests of the Council consistent with federal and state standards.

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PROPERTY, BUDGETARY AND FISCAL CONTROL PROCEDURES AND POLICIES

North Central Florida Regional Planning Council

Effective Date: December 6, 2001 Amended: September 25, 2008 Proposed Amendment: February 24, 2022

Definition:

The word "property" used in these policies means fixtures and other tangible personal property of a non-consumable nature, the value of which is **five hundred (\$500)** five **thousand (\$5,000)** dollars or more, and the normal expected life of which is one year or more.

- 1. Bonding: The Council will provide bonding insurance for the Executive Committee and appropriate staff in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per person.
- 2. Procedure for Signing Checks: All checks shall be signed by a facsimile machine shall be of a type that is secured by two locks, and can be activated only when it is unlocked simultaneously by two keys. The two keys shall be placed in the possession of staff members, selected by the Executive Director, who are not otherwise involved in the accounting operations of the Council. Temporary assignment of the keys to other individuals shall be made by the Executive Director when it is known that the permanent possessor of either of the keys will be out of the office and unavailable to unlock the machine when checks are to be signed.
- Purchasing: The Executive Director, or his designee, shall make purchases to the extent authorized by the budget according to the following procedures:
 - A. Less than \$2,499 \$5,000- Outright Purchase
 - B. \$2,500 \$9,999 \$5,000 to less than \$20,000 Telephone Quotes (3), or purchase under State Contract
 - C. \$10,000 \$24,999 \$20,000 to \$35,000 Written Bids (3), or purchase under State Contract
 - D. \$25,000 and over Over \$35,000- Advertised Sealed Bids with Executive Committee approval or purchase under State Contract. If award is over \$50,000-\$65,000, a Competitive Bid Report is presented to the Council for approval unless the purchase is made under State Contract. The Council will also be advised of any purchase made for \$50,000 \$65,000 or more.
 - E. Upon determination by the Executive Director that it is in the best interest of the Council, services, supplies and materials may be obtained from governmental entities in those instances covered by Items A, B, and C, and upon concurrence by the Executive Committee, in those instances covered by Item D.
- 4. Invoice Payment: The Executive Director, or his designee, will approve vouchers for payment.
- 5. Equipment Leasing: The Executive Director may lease equipment to the extent authorized by the budget; however, lease agreements requiring a commitment of funds for more than one budget year shall be approved by the Council.

- 6. Disposal of Property: Property declared by the Council to be surplus may be disposed of by the following procedures:
 - A. Contribution, upon request, to other local government entities or non-profit, charitable organizations;
 - B. Request the City of Gainesville or Alachua County to sell property on behalf of the Council at an advertised sale at which similar city or county property is being sold.
 - C. Publicly advertise for sealed bids for surplus property valued at more than \$500 five thousand dollars (\$5,000) or more with acceptance of most favorable proposal to the Council by the Council.
 - D. Approval, by the Executive Committee, on an item-by-item basis, proposals by individuals or organizations to purchase surplus property valued at less than \$500 five thousand dollars (\$5,000) when it is concluded that the disposal of such items by any other acceptable method would be excessively expensive.
 - E. Destroy surplus property determined to have little or no resale value.
