

North Central Florida Regional Planning Council Meeting Minutes May 23, 2024

I. INVOCATION

Chair Janice Mortimer noting a quorum being present called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Chair Mortimer gave the invocation.

II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Council and guests pledged allegiance to the flag of the United States of America.

III. INTRODUCTIONS

Chair Mortimer welcomed Kimberly Worley, City Manager, City of Waldo; Diana Davis, Executive Director, Alachua County League of Cities and wife of Council Member Louie Davis; Phil Royce, Suwannee Riverkeeper; Paul Martin, Citizen, Dixie County; and Stew Lilker, Columbia County Observer. Also in attendance at the meeting virtually were Mitchell Allen; Mac James, Citizen, Madison County; and John Quartermann, Withlacoochee, Willacoochee, Alapha, Little, Santa Fe and Suwannee Watershed Coalition.

IV. APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

Chair Mortimer asked that the consent agenda be approved.

ACTION: Commissioner Perkins made the motion, with a second by Commissioner Meeks, to approve the consent agenda. The motion carried unanimously.

V. APPROVAL OF REGULAR AGENDA

Chair Mortimer asked that the regular agenda be approved.

ACTION: Commissioner Alford made the motion, with a second by Commissioner Perkins, to approve the regular agenda. The motion carried unanimously.

VI. NORTH CENTRAL FLORIDA REGIONAL PLANNING COUNCIL PRESENTATION YEAR 2023

Scott Koons, Executive Director, gave a presentation which reviewed Council activities during the past year in the Regional Planning, Public Safety, Economic Development, Local Government Assistance and Transportation Programs of the Council. In particular, he highlighted the services that the Council provides, which benefit its local governments, including community planning assistance, grant application and administration services, transportation planning assistance, hazardous waste monitoring, emergency response planning assistance, and economic development activities. Chair Mortimer thanked Mr. Koons for his presentation.

VII. CHAIR REPORT

A. Mayor Louie Davis Receives 40 Years of Service Award as an Elected Official

Chair Mortimer stated that City of Waldo Mayor Louie Davis was the recent recipient of the John Land Award from the Florida League of Cities recognizing him for 40 years of service as a municipal elected official.

B. Middle and Lower Suwannee River and Withlacoochee River Task Force Appointment

ACTION: Commissioner Alford made the motion, with a second by Commissioner Bouie Hutchinson, to ratify the appointment of Hamilton County Commissioner James Murphy, to the Middle and Lower Suwannee River and Withlacoochee River Task Force as nominated by the Hamilton County Board of County Commissioners and recommended by the Chair. The motion carried unanimously.

- C. Transportation Disadvantaged Program Resolution of Appreciation
 - 1. Stephen Clark

ACTION: Commissioner Adams made the motion, with a second by Commissioner Meeks, to authorize the Chair to sign a Transportation Disadvantaged Program Resolution of Appreciation for former Lafayette County Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board Public Education Voting Representative Stephen Clark. The motion carried unanimously.

VIII. COMMITTEE REPORTS

- A. Executive Committee -
- 1. Removal of Surplus Property from List of Capital Assets

Mr. Koons reported that the item listed on the schedule, which is attached herein and made a part of these minutes, is computer hardware of outdated technology. He stated that the Executive Committee recommends that this hardware be declared as surplus property and that approval be given to dispose of this equipment in accordance with Council policy, which will result in transporting it to the Leveda Brown Hazardous Waste Collection Center in Alachua County, donating the equipment to a nonprofit organization or local government, or recycling the equipment.

ACTION: Commissioner Willits made the motion, with a second by Commissioner Alford, to declare the item listed on the schedule, which is attached herein and made a part of these minutes, as surplus property and to approve the disposal of this equipment in accordance with Council policy. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Middle and Lower Suwannee River and Withlacoochee River Task Force

Mr. Koons reported that the City of Valdosta, Georgia experienced numerous raw sewage spills in 2018. He stated that these spills resulted in the release of raw sewage into the Withlacoochee River, which flows into the Suwannee River, and raw sewage into Mud Creek which flows into the Alapahoochee River then into the Alapaha River and then into the Suwannee River and travels through the north central Florida region to the Gulf of Mexico. Mr. Koons noted that since this problem affected several counties on a regional scale, the Madison County Board of County Commissioners requested the assistance of the Council to help develop a cohesive plan to remedy the situation and restore the reputation of the Middle and Lower Suwannee River and Withlacoochee River as a tourist destination.

Mr. Koons reported that in response to this request, along with support from counties throughout the north central Florida region, the Council established the Middle and Lower Suwannee River and Withlacoochee River Task Force comprised of a county commissioner from each of the 12 counties in the region to address the issues of raw sewage spills by the City of Valdosta, Georgia. He stated that the Council agreed to provide administrative support to the Task Force. Mr. Koons noted that that the Task Force held several joint workshops with the City of Valdosta, Georgia City Council, in 2019, and that the Task Force has been inactive since June 2020.

Mr. Koons reported that on April 12, 2024, the City of Valdosta experienced a significant raw sewage spill. He stated that, as a result of this most recent spill, the Madison County Board of County Commissioners has sent a letter to the Council requesting the Council reactivate the Task Force to address the issues of raw sewage spills by the City of Valdosta, Georgia. Mr. Koons stated that the Executive Committee recommends that the Council reactivate the Task Force to address raw sewage spills by the City of Valdosta, Georgia.

ACTION: Commissioner Perkins made the motion, with a second by Commissioner Bouie Hutchinson, to reactivate the Middle and Lower Suwannee River and Withlacoochee River Task Force. The motion carried unanimously.

3. Mayor Louie Davis Receives 40 Years of Service as an Elected Official Award

Mr. Koons stated that City of Waldo Mayor Louie Davis was the recent recipient of the John Land Award from the Florida League of Cities recognizing him for 40 years of service as a municipal elected official. He read Resolution No. 2024-11 Recognizing Mayor Louie Davis for 40 Years of Service as an Elected Official in its entirety into the record.

ACTION:

Commissioner Bouie Hutchinson made the motion, with a second by Commissioner Perkins, to adopt Resolution No. 2024-11, Recognizing Mayor Louie Davis for 40 Years of Service as an Elected Official which has been attached hereto and made a part of these minutes. The motion carried unanimously.

- B. Clearinghouse Committee None
- C. Program Committee Fiscal Year 2024-25 Overall Program Design

Commissioner Fletcher Hope, Council Vice-Chair and Program Committee Chair, gave the Program Committee report. He stated that the Program Committee met on March 28, 2024 to review a draft of the Overall Program Design for the coming year. Commissioner Hope stated that this document is used as a basis for the development of a budget and is also to give instruction to staff as to the work which is to be done during the next year. He stated that there are no changes proposed in the Overall Program Design which include new programs not previously discussed and/or approved by the Council.

ACTION: Commissioner Hope made the motion, with a second by Commissioner Alford, to approve the Fiscal Year 2024-25 Overall Program Design as recommended by the Program Committee. The motion carried unanimously.

D. Finance Committee - Fiscal Year 2024-25 Budget

Commissioner Robert Brown, Council Treasurer and Finance Committee Chair, gave the Finance Committee report. He stated that the Finance Committee met virtually via communications media technology on May 15, 2024 to review the proposed Fiscal Year 2024-25 budget. He stated the anticipated expenditures for next year will be \$1,680,200 which is \$51,100 more than the current year budget. Commissioner Brown also stated, almost all funds to be expended by the Council are received through contracts for services and grants. He stated there is one exception: Member local governments pay dues, which are proposed to remain at \$0.30 per capita for the 43rd year, and will produce approximately \$174,500.

Commissioner Brown noted that the most significant policy decision that must be made with respect to the budget is related to personnel. He noted that there is provision for a total of seven full-time staff positions, plus funds for part-time positions, which is the same number of staff positions budgeted for the current year. Commissioner Brown stated that the budget includes a recurring increase across the board for all employees, including the Executive Director, equal to three percent of the salary for each employee.

ACTION: Commissioner Brown made the motion, with a second by Mayor Louie Davis, to approve the Fiscal Year 2024-25 budget as recommended by the Finance Committee. The motion carried unanimously.

E. Nominating Committee - Program Year 2024-25 Election of Officers

Commissioner Anthony Adams, Council Immediate Past Chair and Nominating Committee Chair, gave the Nominating Committee report. He stated that the Nominating Committee met virtually via communications media technology on May 15, 2024 to prepare, for the Council's consideration, recommendations concerning officers for Program Year 2024-25.

He stated that the Nominating Committee recommendations for officers are, as follows:

Chair - Fletcher Hope, City of Archer Vice-Chair - Robert Brown, Hamilton County Treasurer - John Meeks, Levy County Secretary - Mary Alford, Alachua County Immediate Past Chair - Janice Mortimer, City of Starke

Chair Mortimer asked for any nominations from the floor. Hearing no nominations from the floor, she closed the nominations.

ACTION: Commissioner Adams made the motion, with a second by Commissioner Perkins, to elect the slate of nominees for officers to a one-year term for Program Year 2024-25 as recommended by the Nominating Committee. The motion carried unanimously.

IX. EX-OFFICIO MEMBER REPORTS

David Tyler, Rural Planning Manager, Florida Department of Transportation District 2, stated that the District is available to assist counties and cities with identifying and implementing transportation projects.

Tyler Winburn, Legislative and Government Affairs Coordinator, Suwannee River Water Management District, stated the District Board recently adopted the 2024 Western Water Supply Plan for the Western Planning Region consisting of the counties located west of the Suwannee River that designates the area as a water supply caution area. He noted that the local governments in Dixie County, Lafayette County, Levy County, Madison County and Taylor County in the north central Florida region will need to amend their comprehensive plans to add a water supply and work plan by September 2025. Mr. Winburn also reported the District will be launching their Leave No Litter Campaign next month.

Kathryn Craver, Outreach/Communications Director, Florida Department of Environmental Protection, Northeast District, reported that Water Quality Protection Grant applications are due to the Department by June 30, 2024. She noted that entrance fees for Florida State Parks will be waived for all visitors during the Memorial Day Weekend from May 24, 2024 to May 27, 2024. Ms. Craver reported that, during the month of July 2024 Sales Tax Holiday, sales tax will be waived for the purchase of outdoor equipment.

X. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Stew Lilker, Columbia County Observer, discussed I-75 traffic safety, regional workforce and CareerSource Crown, and Memorial Day.

John Quartermann, Withlacoochee, Willacoochee, Alapha, Little, Santa Fe and Suwannee Watershed Coalition, thanked the Council for taking action earlier in the meeting to reactivate the Middle and Lower Suwannee River and Withlacoochee River Task Force. He also discussed litter in the Withlacoochee River near Valdosta, Georgia and a proposed titanium mine near the Okefenokee National Wildlife Refuge in Georgia.

XI. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT

A. Florida Regional Councils Association Monthly Activity Report

Mr. Koons reported that the Florida Regional Councils Association is the statewide organization of the ten regional planning councils. He stated that the Association strengthens Florida's regional planning councils, partners with government and the business community to enhance regional economic prosperity and improves the consistency and quality of regional planning councils programs to ensure they add value to state, regional and local initiatives. Mr. Koons also stated that the Association strives to accomplish these goals by carrying out the activities listed in the April 2024 activity report included in the Council meeting packet. He reviewed the activities listed in the April 2024 report.

B. Florida Chamber Foundation ScorecardTM

Mr. Koons reported that the Florida Chamber Foundation has developed the Florida Scorecard TM to provide Florida leaders the metrics needed to secure Florida's future. He stated that the Florida Chamber Foundation's objective to developing a 20-year, statewide strategic plan requires a commitment to measuring our current status and progress toward the stated goals of the Six Pillars 20-year Strategic Plan. Mr. Koons noted that the Scorecard reports metrics for each of the following Six Pillars: Talent and Supply Education, Innovation and Economic Development, Infrastructure and Growth Leadership, Business Climate and Competitiveness, Civic and Governance Systems, and Quality of Life and Quality Places. He reviewed the May 2024 Scorecard TM that was included in the Council meeting packet.

C. Financial Disclosure Report Filing

Mr. Koons reported that all members of the Council are required to file a financial disclosure form by July 1st of each year. He stated that the financial disclosure form filed by county commissioners and city commissioners for their elected offices fulfills this requirement. Mr. Koons noted that local elected officials and all other filers are required to file the form online this year. He noted gubernatorial members received an email earlier in the month of May 2024 providing instructions for filing the form online.

XII. COUNCIL MEMBER ANNOUNCEMENTS

Commissioner Willits discussed proposed federal legislation that would increase the weight limit for trucks on the interstate highway system and other United States highways.

Commisioner Bouie Hutchinson announced that the 92nd Annual Homecoming will be held on June 29, 2024 at 2:00 p.m. at Shell Elementary School in Hawthorne.

Councilwoman Hampton announced that the Juneteenth Gospel Jubilee will be held on June 15, 2024 at 11:00 a.m. at Rosehead Park in Perry.

Mr. Koons presented Chair Mortimer with a John Moran framed landscape photograph of an American Lotus at Paynes Prairie Preserve State Park for her service as Chair.

XIII. NEXT MEETING

The meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

Chair Mortimer stated that the next Council meeting is scheduled to be held on June 27, 2024.
