



RE: List of Priority Projects- Paratransit Priorities

Dear Lynn:

As you know, the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area submits its List of Priority Projects to the Florida Department of Transportation each year. This list contains projects that are needed, but not currently funded (or are only partially funded).

Enclosed are last year's paratransit priorities lists that were approved by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area. The Florida Department of Transportation District Two Tentative Work Program includes the typical planning assistance and Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund trip (Table 14) and equipment grant (Table 15) funding. However, the Tentative Work Program does not include any new grants for the following Federal Transit Administration (FTA) programs:

- 1. Section 5311 Nonurbanized Area Formula Program (Table 16);
- 2. Section 5316 Job Access Reverse Commute (JARC) (Table 17); and
- 3. Section 5317 New Freedom Program (Table 18).

We are requesting that the Alachua County Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinating Board either continue with the current priority lists or develop updated lists of paratransit project priorities for the Gainesville Metropolitan Area. We would like to have this information by Friday, January 31, 2013.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Alachua County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan amendments.

BACKGROUND

Projects selected for funding under the Elderly Individuals and individuals with Disabilities, JARC, and New Freedom programs must be derived from a Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan. The Plan must be developed through a process that includes representatives of public, private, and nonprofit transportation and human services providers and participation by the public.

In addition, according to the Florida Administrative Code (FAC) 41-2.011(6):

"In cooperation with the local Coordinating Board, the Community Transportation Coordinator shall review all applications for local government, federal and state transportation disadvantaged funds submitted from or planned for use in their designated service area."

Attached are draft amendments to the Alachua County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan that meet the Federal and State requirements. Also, attached are the Regional Transit System's applications for U.S.C. Section 5310 and 5311 Grant funds.

Current System Description

Regional Transit System's Mission Statement

To enhance the quality of life in our community by providing safe, courteous, equitable, reliable, and energy-efficient transportation services.

Ridership and Routes:

The Regional Transit System (RTS) is a division of the City of Gainesville's Public Works Department and currently employs 191 drivers to operate a fleet of 115 Bio-diesel buses with two hybrid buses for a total of 117. RTS provides its own training and maintenance, and requires that every driver maintain a current Commercial Driver's License (CDL). RTS operates 33 city routes, 9 campus routes and five Later Gator routes. Later Gator A runs every weekday and the other Later Gator routes run on Thursday, Friday and/or Saturday until 3 a.m. Sunday service runs ten city routes from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Ridership continues to remain strong; in FY 12 the fixed routes maintained our strong ridership numbers and exceeded the 10 million passenger mark. RTS continues to have one of the highest per capita trip rates in Florida at 39.7 passenger trips per person. Though our number dropped from the previous mark of 43.2 it was due to an increase of hours of service and the addition of new routes. RTS added routes 39 and 76 because a bill was passed in 2011 allowing Santa Fe Students to be charged a transportation fee. RTS continues to receive requests from UF and the public to provide even more service. RTS is in the planning stages of building a new maintenance facility that will allow us to increase the size of our fixed route fleet. RTS also provides service during UF home football games for a \$10 round trip fee in order to decrease drunken driving and game day traffic congestion.

Prior to 1998, RTS operated as a small urban transit system experiencing declining ridership and community support. The University of Florida and the City of Gainesville then began a partnership to include transit services in the University's student fee. The fee was originally set at 19 cents per credit hour and has increased to a current student fee of \$7.88 per credit hour. Since that partnership was formed, ridership has increased from less than one million annual riders in 1996 to more than 10 million today.

All RTS fixed routes are serviced by ADA complementary paratransit service, which is provided by MV Transportation, the Community Transportation Coordinator for Alachua County. MV Transportation is a private, for-profit, self-insured agency that employs 58 drivers, 9 of which have CDLs although they are not required to, and 18 administrative staff. MV Transportation also provides its own training and its own maintenance. In FY12 they provided more than 118,000 trips system-wide, 93,137 of which were disabled.

Mobility aided clients still represent a large segment of paratransit riders who use the RTS fixed route system, but mobility aided paratransit trips provided by the CTC have continued to increase in FY 12 within the city limits, largely due to cuts in Medicaid that have forced more elderly and disabled clients to use ADA-funded transit. In an attempt to keep costs down, RTS leases 20 vans to the CTC for demand response transportation. In order to continue to provide paratransit service for the elderly and disabled in Gainesville and in Alachua County, RTS needs the 5310 funds to maintain the paratransit vehicle fleet in order to keep paratransit costs down.

With mounting economic pressures and city-wide budget cuts, RTS is faced with increased challenges to meet the demand for new and mandated services including ADA complementary

paratransit services. Overcrowding on fixed route buses, on-time performance, maintenance and operational constraints, equity issues and funding are just some of the issues continues to face. As the fixed route service enhancements are implemented such as expanded hours, increases in geographic coverage and other improvements, those same enhancements will affect demand response service criteria and will inevitably increase the projected number of ADA trips.

Types of Service Provided

RTS contracts with the local CTC, MV transportation, to provide reservation (scheduled 24 hours in advance) transportation services, demand response transportation and stretcher service. These services are provided to employment centers, medical facilities, health services, shopping and recreational activities. Medical transportation is critical in Alachua County and its surrounding counties due to a high concentration of specialized medical services offered in the Gainesville area. In addition, there are a variety of funding agencies that purchase transportation from the local CTC. These include Medicaid, Transportation Disadvantaged (TD), ADA, Elder Care, Vocational Rehabilitation and Foster Grandparents. Many of these agencies work very closely with the CTC to ensure that transportation is provided to those who truly need it.

All transportation services are scheduled and dispatched by MV transportation. Hospital discharge services are provided 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Demand response transportation services are provided Monday through Friday from 6 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. and Saturday from 6 a.m. until 6:30 p.m. Paratransit service is provided Monday through Saturday from 6 a.m. until 9 p.m. and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. RTS provides the paratransit service for routes running after 9PM and in the late night area until 3 am. Fifty percent of the CTC's trips are subscribed system-wide. The transportation services provided by MV transportation are coordinated with 100% of the existing human service and medical facilities in Alachua County. These services often provide an alternative mode, and in most cases, the only opportunity for transportation to elderly and disabled persons who live in the rural area. A large portion of the transportation in Alachua County consists of elderly and disabled residents living in the rural parts of the County requiring service to the urban area either for medical reasons, employment or recreational activities.

The Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) cost-share program for individuals eligible for Medicaid funded trips has increased the strain on limited transportation funds provided by the city. Dialysis patients have been particularly affected; most are on fixed incomes having to travel as much as three times a week. MV Transportation took steps to manage the TD trust fund dollars to avoid prioritization by changing the eligibility criteria; this has caused problems for disabled clients living in the outlying areas that were previously eligible for TD funded trips but failed to meet the TD requirements due to income. In previous years RTS was awarded USC 5311 and USC 5317 grants which allowed RTS to expand the ADA service area and alleviate some of the strain on the TD trust funds. The award of the 5310 grant will ensure we are able to maintain the ability to provide the trips the elderly and disabled need especially in the unincorporated area around Gainesville. RTS would like to continue service to these individuals, but without the award of 5310 funds to replace the 5317 funds that were merged into the 5310 grant under MAPP 21 these individuals will have to use TD funds and would be subject to prioritization. This would be a tremendous hardship especially with the cuts in Medicaid that have forced so many Dialysis patients into using paratransit and demand response to get to their appointments. RTS will continue to look for ways to accommodate the transportation needs of the citizens of Alachua County and values and appreciates FDOT support to help RTS in this endeavor.

- 1. If awarded, the 5310 money will be used to continue the existing level of service by purchasing transportation for the disabled and disadvantaged individuals who reside in unincorporated Gainesville and need transportation. When the grant was first awarded in FY2010 under USC 5317, it allowed the City of Gainesville to expand the ADA service area. The demand for trips in the unincorporated continues to increase and the TD funds are progressively being prioritized into the top four categories. RTS is working with the Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) to make the Transportation Disadvantaged (TD) and county funds stretch as far as possible to purchase and provide transportation where the need is greatest. The housing in the outlying areas is more affordable, therefore more of the disabled and elderly live in the fringe areas and are requesting service This grant will continue to allow the city to purchase transportation for current riders and to include more of the senior and disabled citizens from the unincorporated fringe surrounding Gainesville; thus stretching the existing funding received by the CTC from the county and the Transportation Disadvantaged trust fund. The award of this grant will maintain the expanded service area and continue to maintain a better quality of life for the many people that otherwise would not have access to medical care, shopping, and work.
- 2. The 5317 funds were an integral part of providing transportation service to the disabled and elderly populations in unincorporated Gainesville. RTS hopes to continue to receive the new MAPP program 5310 funds to maintain the services provided under what was USC 5317 New Freedom. RTS contracts with the local community transportation coordinator (CTC), MV Transportation Inc., to provide service to those who are certified under the Americans with Disability Act or ADA and demand response trips under 5311. A financial tripod was created with TD funds. 5311 funds and 5317 funds to provide stable financial base to meet the transportation needs of the community. As the CTC, MV Transportation has been designated to provide all the paratransit and demand response transportation in Alachua County. The continuation of 5310 grant funds will allow RTS to preserve the financial tripod and maintain the existing level of service by providing trips to the current users living in unincorporated Gainesville and to extend service on Sunday to ADA and elderly clients living outside the city limits. Medicaid has disenfranchised a majority of the dialysis patients causing their trips to be funded either under TD or the ADA. This has severely limited TD funds which purchase roughly 50 trips per day, 46 of which are taken to provide trips for dialysis clients. This severely restricts other clients living in unincorporated Gainesville access to transportation. RTS can help to alleviate or lessen these limitations by providing trips to the ADA and elderly clients that live outside the service area but have a Gainesville address and would otherwise only have access to transportation using TD funds or 5311 funds.

Since Gainesville has a fixed route system, RTS is required to provide ADA Paratransit service to the disabled within the ADA service area. ADA clients living off the fixed route have the choice of using either the fixed route or paratransit. Alachua County citizen's living outside the ADA service area can apply for TD or Medicaid transportation. RTS has been able to provide a third option to these elderly and disabled citizens under what was Section 5317, now RTS would like to continue providing this service area to the unincorporated areas just outside the ADA service area. As cited before these areas do have do have several low income and public housing areas. Since they are just outside the city limits they provide access to affordable housing, transportation and amenities.

Current System Description

Regional Transit System's Mission Statement

To enhance the quality of life in our community by providing safe, courteous, equitable, reliable, and energy-efficient transportation services.

Ridership and Routes:

The Regional Transit System (RTS) is a division of the City of Gainesville's Public Works Department and currently employs 191 drivers to operate a fleet of 115 Bio-diesel buses with two hybrid buses for a total of 117. RTS provides its own training and maintenance, and requires that every driver maintain a current Commercial Driver's License (CDL). RTS operates 33 city routes, 9 campus routes and five Later Gator routes. Later Gator A runs every weekday and the other Later Gator routes run on Thursday, Friday and/or Saturday until 3 a.m. Sunday service runs ten city routes from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Ridership continues to remain strong; in FY 12 the fixed routes maintained our strong ridership numbers and exceeded the 10 million passenger mark. RTS continues to have one of the highest per capita trip rates in Florida at 39.7 passenger trips per person. Though our number dropped from the previous mark of 43.2 it was due to an increase of hours of service and the addition of new routes. RTS added routes 39 and 76 because a bill was passed in 2011 allowing Santa Fe Students to be charged a transportation fee. RTS continues to receive requests from UF and the public to provide even more service. RTS is in the planning stages of building a new maintenance facility that will allow us to increase the size of our fixed route fleet. RTS also provides service during UF home football games for a \$10 round trip fee in order to decrease drunken driving and game day traffic congestion.

Prior to 1998, RTS operated as a small urban transit system experiencing declining ridership and community support. The University of Florida and the City of Gainesville then began a partnership to include transit services in the University's student fee. The fee was originally set at 19 cents per credit hour and has increased to a current student fee of \$7.88 per credit hour. Since that partnership was formed, ridership has increased from less than one million annual riders in 1996 to more than 10 million today.

All RTS fixed routes are serviced by ADA complementary paratransit service, which is provided by MV Transportation, the Community Transportation Coordinator for Alachua County. MV Transportation is a private, for-profit, self-insured agency that employs 58 drivers, 9 of which have CDLs although they are not required to, and 18 administrative staff. MV Transportation also provides its own training and its own maintenance. In FY12 they provided more than 118,000 trips system-wide, 93,137 of which were disabled.

Mobility aided clients still represent a large segment of paratransit riders who use the RTS fixed route system, but mobility aided paratransit trips provided by the CTC have continued to increase in FY 12 within the city limits, largely due to cuts in Medicaid that have forced more elderly and disabled clients to use ADA-funded transit. In an attempt to keep costs down, RTS leases 20 vans to the CTC for demand response transportation. In order to continue to provide paratransit service for the elderly and disabled in Gainesville and in Alachua County, RTS needs the 5310 funds to maintain the paratransit vehicle fleet in order to keep paratransit costs down.

WB12-mounting economic pressures and city-wide budget cuts, RTS is faced with increased challenges to meet the demand for new and mandated services including ADA complementary

paratransit services. Overcrowding on fixed route buses, on-time performance, maintenance and operational constraints, equity issues and funding are just some of the issues continues to face. As the fixed route service enhancements are implemented such as expanded hours, increases in geographic coverage and other improvements, those same enhancements will affect demand response service criteria and will inevitably increase the projected number of ADA trips.

Types of Service Provided

RTS contracts with the local CTC, MV transportation, to provide reservation (scheduled 24 hours in advance) transportation services, demand response transportation and stretcher service. These services are provided to employment centers, medical facilities, health services, shopping and recreational activities. Medical transportation is critical in Alachua County and its surrounding counties due to a high concentration of specialized medical services offered in the Gainesville area. In addition, there are a variety of funding agencies that purchase transportation from the local CTC. These include Medicaid, Transportation Disadvantaged (TD), ADA, Elder Care, Vocational Rehabilitation and Foster Grandparents. Many of these agencies work very closely with the CTC to ensure that transportation is provided to those who truly need it.

All transportation services are scheduled and dispatched by MV transportation. Hospital discharge services are provided 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Demand response transportation services are provided Monday through Friday from 6 a.m. until 8:30 p.m. and Saturday from 6 a.m. until 6:30 p.m. Paratransit service is provided Monday through Saturday from 6 a.m. until 9 p.m. and Sunday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. RTS provides the paratransit service for routes running after 9PM and in the late night area until 3 am. Fifty percent of the CTC's trips are subscribed system-wide. The transportation services provided by MV transportation are coordinated with 100% of the existing human service and medical facilities in Alachua County. These services often provide an alternative mode, and in most cases, the only opportunity for transportation to elderly and disabled persons who live in the rural area. A large portion of the transportation in Alachua County consists of elderly and disabled residents living in the rural parts of the County requiring service to the urban area either for medical reasons, employment or recreational activities.

The Agency for Health Care Administration (AHCA) cost-share program for individuals eligible for Medicaid funded trips has increased the strain on limited transportation funds provided by the city. Dialysis patients have been particularly affected; most are on fixed incomes having to travel as much as three times a week. MV Transportation took steps to manage the TD trust fund dollars to avoid prioritization by changing the eligibility criteria; this has caused problems for disabled clients living in the outlying areas that were previously eligible for TD funded trips but failed to meet the TD requirements due to income. In previous years RTS was awarded USC 5311 and USC 5317 grants which allowed RTS to expand the ADA service area and alleviate some of the strain on the TD trust funds. The award of the 5310 grant will ensure we are able to maintain the fleet to provide the trips the elderly and disabled need. RTS will continue to look for ways to accommodate the transportation needs of the citizens of Alachua County and values and appreciates FDOT support to help RTS in this endeavor.

Proposed Project Description

- 1. If awarded, the 5310 money will be used to replace one of the 20 vehicles currently provided by the City of Gainesville RTS to the contracted local transportation coordinator, currently MV Transportation, to provide service to the elderly and disabled of Alachua County. As the Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC), MV Transportation has been designated to provide all the paratransit and demand response transportation in Alachua County. The van would be used to continue to provide the existing level of service. The 2007 21' Champion Cutaway van (vehicle #3210) that would be replaced has accrued more than 245,878 miles and has reached the mileage at which FDOT Useful Life Standard recommends that paratransit vehicles be replaced. As one of a fleet of several vehicles that have exceeded both the age and mileage at which FDOT recommends paratransit vehicles be replaced, a replacement vehicle would reduce fleet age and enable RTS and MV Transportation to continue to offer reliable service to its existing service area.
- 2. The Section 5310 capital funds are an integral part of maintaining the services described in Exhibit A. The replacement vehicle will allow the CTC to continue to provide paratransit and demand response service to the elderly and disabled in Alachua County. The vehicle will be maintained by MV Transportation and will be used for service in the urban and rural areas. By replacing the vehicle, RTS and MV will be able to continue the level of service which is currently offered while reducing fleet age. RTS also plans to purchase a Mobile Data Terminal (MDT) with this vehicle ensures there will always be a working MDT on our paratransit vehicles.
- 3. The vehicle that will be replaced if the 5310 Grant is received currently has more than 245,878 miles and has exceeded the recommended mileage that FDOT Useful Life Standard states for paratransit vehicles to be replaced. While the rest of the vehicles the city has provided to MV are relatively new, the majority of the vehicles that MV owns are 2003 models and are past both the mileage and age recommended for replacement. The Alachua County MTPO voted in 2008 to divert FY09 STP funds earmarked to buy paratransit vans in order to fund roadwork projects. This will continue to affect Gainesville's ability to replace the vehicles now and in the future, starting with the 6 (six) vehicles that under the Useful Life Standard reached the end of their cycle in 2012, with no replacements forecasted.
- 4. The grant will be used to purchase a new van and MDT to allow the CTC to maintain the current level of service for those who utilize demand response services. This van will replace existing equipment that has extended beyond its recommended cycle of service. As stewards for the transportation needs of the Gainesville and Alachua County citizens it is our responsibility to forecast the requirements for the provision of the service and keep vehicles current per the FDOT Useful Life Standard. RTS and MV collaborated to purchase Mobile Data Terminals for the entire fleet. This has improved efficiency and continues to provide real time reporting data.

- 5. The grant will be used to replace vehicle #3210, a 2007 21' Champion Cutaway van, by purchasing a new 21' Champion ADA accessible cutaway van that will be used to provide service to the citizens of Alachua County. It also would purchase a MDT to ensure the mobile data system integrity. Note 1 under vehicle #3208 on the "Current Vehicle and Transportation Equipment Inventory" explains that grant funding from FY12 will replace this vehicle, the new vehicle was ordered in 2012 after the 5317 grant was awarded and has yet to arrive, but is expected at any time. The MDT was purchased and has been delivered.
- 6. If this grant is awarded the current vehicle will remain on the road and in service until the new vehicle is received and placed in service, at which time the old van will be evaluated and disposition determined. The Federal guidelines state the used vehicles will be put out to public auction and RTS uses EBAY to dispose of vehicles that have reached the FDOT Useful Life criteria. The new vehicle will be maintained by MV Transportation. RTS conducts the inspections required by the FTA and FDOT regulations. In addition, RTS will continue to ensure MV Transportation performs all system safety checks and the FDOT maintenance requirements are conducted bi-annually. To avoid interruptions to service MV Transportation will conduct required preventative maintenance service and FDOT scheduled maintenance programs at non peak hours.
- 7. This vehicle will be used by MV Transportation who has been designated by the State of Florida as the CTC. As the primary operator MV does not have subcontracts with other lessees or operators. As the primary operator they have all of the vehicles retained by RTS to provide service. RTS provides after hours ADA service, by request, using supervisor vehicles. 7a. Is not applicable as MV Transportation is the only operator.
- 8. RTS is part of the City of Gainesville under the Public Works department and is a local government agency. Since Gainesville has a fixed route system, RTS is required to provide ADA Paratransit service to the disabled within the ADA service area. ADA clients living off the fixed route have the choice of using either the fixed route or paratransit. Alachua County citizens living outside the ADA service area can apply for TD or Medicaid transportation. The intent is that RTS will receive the 5310 Grant funds to purchase a paratransit van to continue to provide service to the elderly and disabled residing in Gainesville and Alachua County. RTS's fixed route drivers are represented by ATU LU #1579. MV Transportation drivers do not belong to a union. RTS and MV are drug free work places and adhere to the standards set forth under the FTA guidelines.








TRANSPORTATION DISADVANTAGED SERVICE PLAN (TDSP) STANDARDS ALACHUA COUNTY, JANUARY 2013
