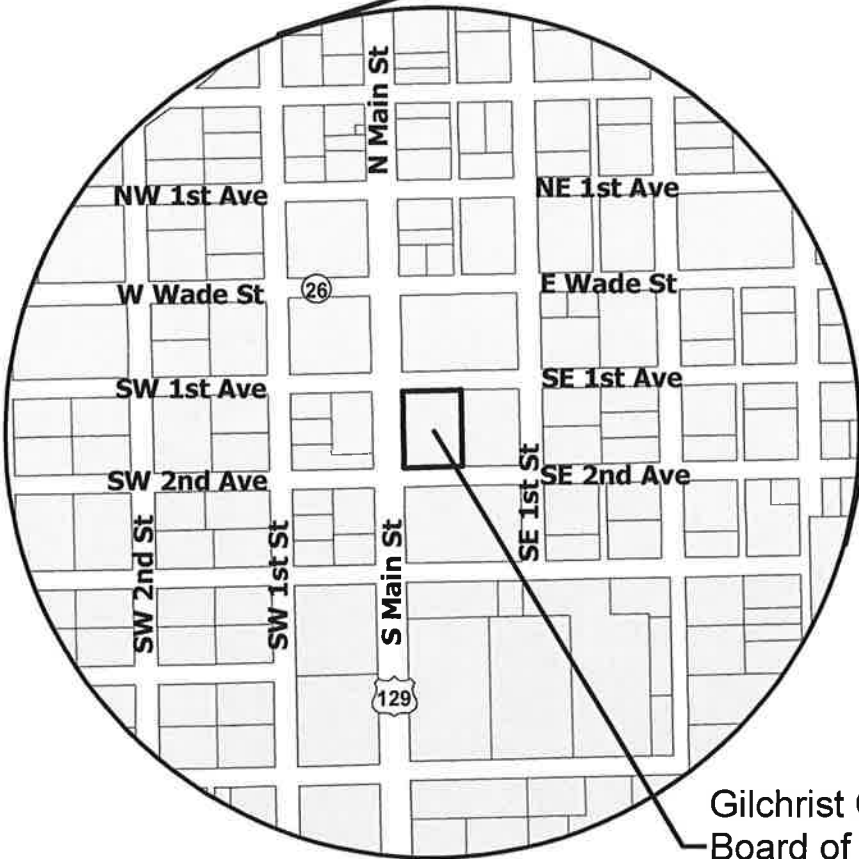
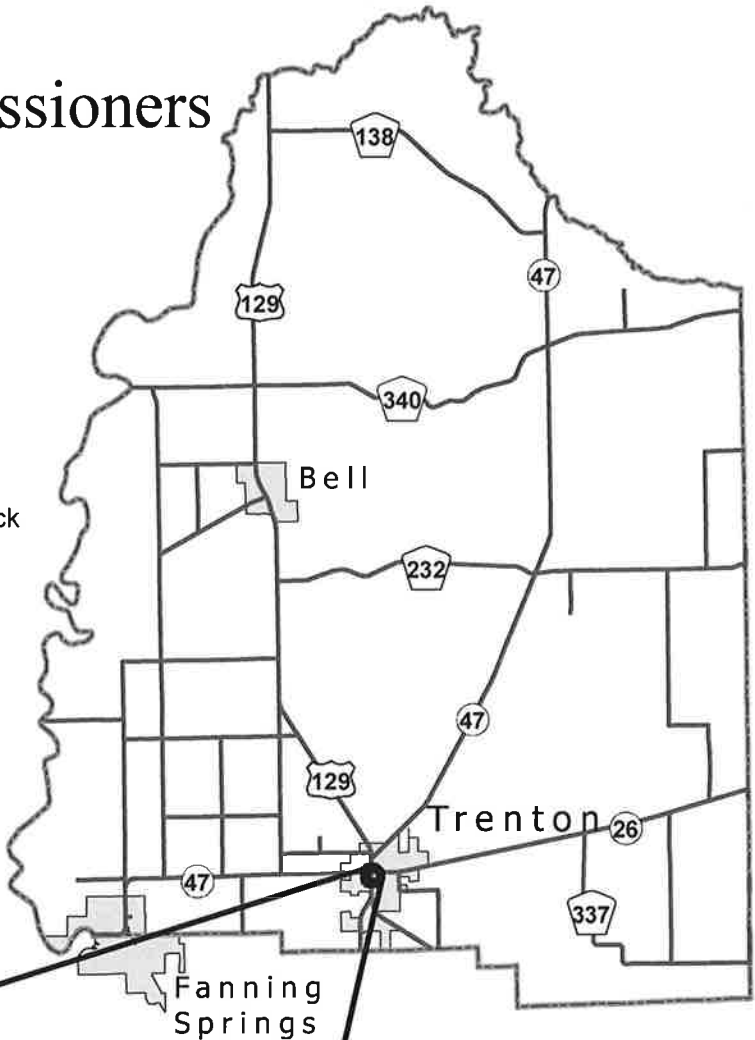

I. BUSINESS MEETING CALL TO ORDER

Vic-Chair Alana McKay called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

A. Invocation

Mr. Matthew Pearson gave the invocation.

B. Pledge of Allegiance

Vice-Chair McKay led the Board in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

C. Introductions

Vice-Chair McKay asked everyone to introduce themselves.

D. Approval of the Meeting Agenda

ACTION: Sandra Collins moved to approve the meeting agenda. Richard Esseck seconded; motion passed unanimously.

E. Approval of the September 17, 2014 Meeting Minutes

ACTION: Richard Esseck moved to approve the September 17, 2014 meeting minutes. Alicia Fowler seconded; motion passed unanimously.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Community Transportation Coordinator Annual Performance Evaluation

Ms. Lynn Godfrey, North Central Florida Regional Planning Council Senior Planner, stated that the Board is required to annually evaluate Suwannee River Economic Council's performance as the Gilchrist County Community Transportation Coordinator. She said Suwannee River Economic Council's draft annual performance evaluation is included in the meeting materials. She said there are no findings or recommendations.

The Board reviewed the draft performance evaluation.

Sandra Collins commended Suwannee River Economic Council for the excellent job they do.

ACTION: Richard Esseck moved to approve Suwannee River Economic Council's annual performance evaluation. Sandra Collins seconded; motion passed unanimously.

B. Rural Area Capital Assistance Program Grant Application

Ms. Godfrey stated that Suwannee River Economic Council has applied for Rural Area Capital Assistance Program Grant funds. She said this grant program is administered by the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged. She explained that grant funds awarded by this program can be used to address capital transportation needs in rural areas of the State and eligible applicants are designated Community Transportation Coordinators.

Ms. Godfrey said the Board needs to review and approve Suwannee River Economic Council's grant application.

ACTION: Richard Esseck moved to approve Suwannee River Economic Council's application for Rural Area Capital Assistance Program Grant funds. Sandra Collins seconded; motion passed unanimously.

C. Gilchrist County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan Amendment

Ms. Godfrey stated that projects selected for Federal and State funding must be derived from a Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan. She said Suwannee River Economic Council's applications for U.S.C. Section 5310 and Rural Capital Assistance Grant funds have been added to the Gilchrist County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan in order to meet the Federal and State requirements. She said the Board needs to approve the addition of these grant projects.

ACTION: Tonya Hiers moved to approve the Gilchrist County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan amendments. Alicia Fowler; motion passed unanimously.

D. 2013/14 Annual Operations Report

Ms. Godfrey stated that Suwannee River Economic Council is required to submit an annual operations report to the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged by September 15 of each year. She said the Fiscal Year 2013/14 Annual Operations Report is included in the meeting materials for the Board's review.

The Board reviewed the Fiscal Year 2013/14 Annual Operations Report.

E. Appoint Grievance Committee

Ms. Godfrey stated that the Board's Grievance Procedures requires the Chair to appoint five voting members to a Grievance Committee.

A. Comments

1. Members

Vice-Chair McKay stated that the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration has issued a Request for Information for the provision of non-emergency transportation services on a statewide or regional basis. She explained that the non-emergency transportation services being bid are the remaining Medicaid services provided by the Community Transportation Coordinators.

Richard Esseck said he would prefer for Gilchrist County to decide who provides Medicaid non-emergency transportation in Gilchrist County instead of the Managed Care Organizations.

Brittney Keeling asked how Suwannee River Economic Council schedules return dialysis trips.

Mr. Matthew Pearson, Suwannee River Economic Council Executive Director, explained that they must group as many riders on the vehicles as possible because of limited financial resources. He said they base other trips on the dialysis patients' schedules.

SUBJECT: Gilchrist County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan Amendments

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Gilchrist County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan amendments.

BACKGROUND

Projects selected for funding under Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) Act programs must be derived from a Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan. The Plan must be developed through a process that includes representatives of public, private, and nonprofit transportation and human services providers and participation by the public.

In addition, according to the Florida Administrative Code 41-2.011(6):

“In cooperation with the local Coordinating Board, the Community Transportation Coordinator shall review all applications for local government, federal and state transportation disadvantaged funds submitted from or planned for use in their designated service area.”

Attached are draft amendments to the Gilchrist County Transportation Disadvantaged Service Plan that meet the Federal and State requirements. Also, attached are Suwannee River Economic Council's applications for U.S.C. Section 5311 and 5339 grant funds.

3. Barriers to Coordination

Lack of agency knowledge of Chapter 427, Florida Statutes and its requirements is a barrier to coordination. More education of the Transportation Disadvantaged Program and benefits of the coordinated transportation system is needed for agencies that provide transportation to their clients. The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged could assist in this effort by requesting that State agencies that purchase transportation services for their clients educate their district and local offices of Florida's Transportation Disadvantaged Program.

Increasing Florida's Transportation Disadvantaged Program requirements is a potential barrier to coordination because increasing requirements add to the cost of transportation services. If transportation services can be purchased at a lesser cost outside of the coordinated system, agencies may choose to do so.

5. Goals, Objectives and Strategies

GOAL I: **Coordinate all transportation disadvantaged services that are funded with local, state and/or federal government funds.**

OBJECTIVE: Identify agencies that receive local, state and/or federal government transportation funds that are not coordinated through the Community Transportation Coordinator.

Strategy a: Identify agencies in Gilchrist County that receive local, state and/or federal funds to transport clients or purchase vehicles.

Strategy b: Contact agencies to obtain information about coordination opportunities.

Strategy c: Determine whether a purchase of service contract, coordination contract or subcontract should be executed with the identified agencies to coordinate the transportation services that are being provided.

GOAL II: **Identify unmet transportation needs in Gilchrist County.**

OBJECTIVE: Identify unmet transportation needs and discuss ways to meet these needs at each local Coordinating Board meeting.

Strategy: The Community Transportation Coordinator shall report quarterly the number and types of transportation services that are requested which it is unable to provide.

GOAL III: **The Community Transportation Coordinator shall provide transportation services that are consumer oriented and effectively coordinate trips.**

OBJECTIVE: Provide transportation services that maximize the use of all vehicles to eliminate duplication of service without unduly inconveniencing the rider.

Strategy a: The Community Transportation Coordinator shall report on a quarterly basis the number of single passenger trips provided.

Strategy b: The Community Transportation Coordinator shall work with purchasing agencies and service providers (doctors' offices, hospitals, etc.) to arrange appointments to group trips.



Suwannee River Economic Council, Inc. is a non profit organization chartered in 1964 whose purpose is to provide services to low income and elderly citizens to alleviate poverty. SREC, Inc. currently is the state designated transportation provider in four rural North Florida counties including Dixie, Bradford, Gilchrist, and Lafayette County. A voluntary Board of Directors governs SREC, Inc. The Board employs an Executive Director, who has normal CEO responsibilities with the agency and the many programs it administers. SREC, Inc has four program directors providing direct supervision of the ongoing programs, including transportation. The Director of Transportation is Chuck Hewett. He is responsible for management, training and administration of the Transportation program. Currently, SREC, Inc. has approximately twenty transportation employees on staff to help in this endeavor.

As the Community Transportation Coordinator for four rural counties in North Florida counties, SREC, Inc. operates partial brokerages with all trips provided by SREC, Inc. with the exception of stretcher services, which are contracted to a private contractor. SREC, Inc. provides mainly demand response services. SREC, Inc. requires twenty four hour notice for trip request.

Gilchrist County is a rural community. There are minimal medical facilities available to the residents. Therefore, the vast majority of medical appointments are made in Gainesville where facilities are more prevalent. It is over 60 miles to Gainesville where these appointments are necessary.

Currently, in Gilchrist County, SREC, Inc. uses one dispatcher/scheduler and averages four drivers using four vans for daily services. SREC, Inc. anticipates providing 4,808 trips in the upcoming year. Trip purposes include medical, nutritional, shopping, and employment. A planned trip schedule for out of County trips is in place to allow for increased ridership on long trips. Currently, the schedule allows for two trips to Gainesville Monday thru Friday. Trips are also scheduled daily to Chiefland, as well as multiple trips daily in and around Gilchrist County.

SREC, Inc. has maintained excellent safety and training records and continues to provide safe, efficient, cost effective services for the residents of Gilchrist County, Florida who need transportation services. In fact, SREC, Inc. has recently gone through process of updating all of its safety records including the newly updated SSPP.

Therefore, the requested 5311 funding helps offset the cost of the entire transportation system and allows for continued transportation services to be provided to those in need in Gilchrist County.

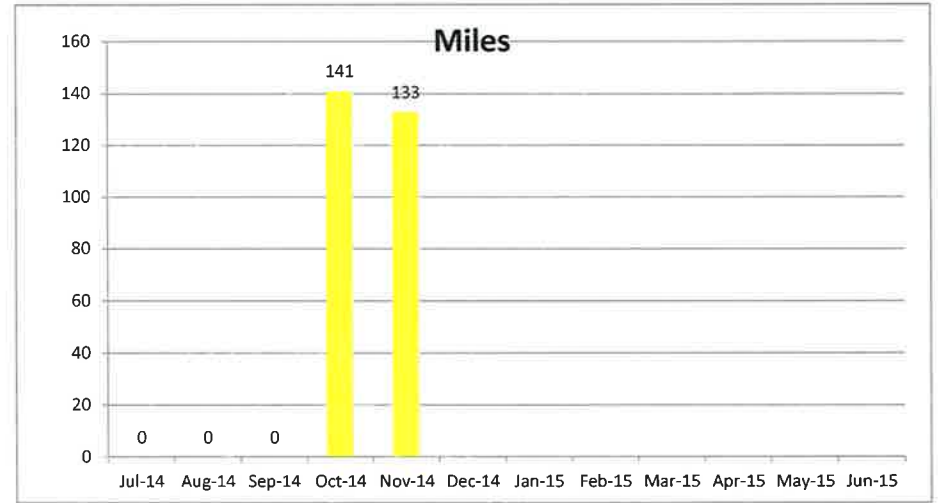
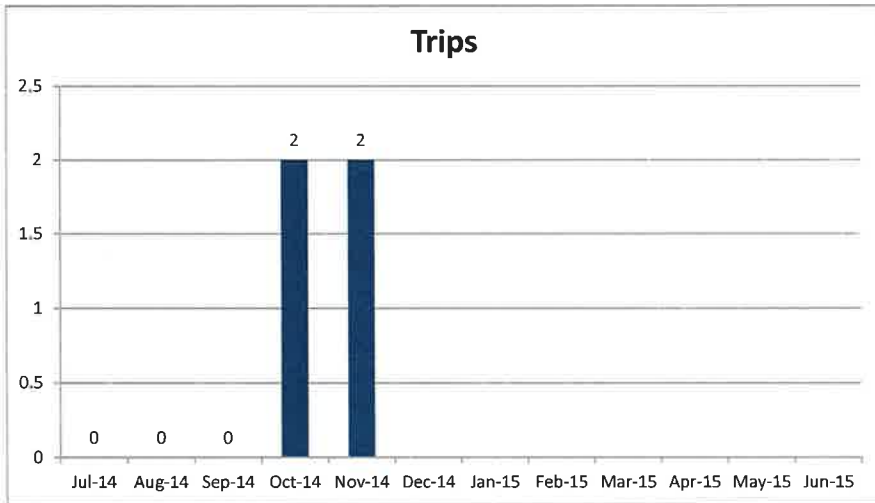
