#### CALL TO ORDER

Chair Helen Warren called the meeting to order at 5:13 p.m.

# I. APPROVAL OF THE MEETING AGENDA AND CONSENT AGENDA

Chair Warren asked for approval of the meeting agenda and consent agenda.

Scott Koons, Executive Director, discussed amendments to the meeting agenda.

MOTION: Commissioner Hutchinson moved to amend the Meeting Agenda to add item  $VII_B$ . NW 43rd Street and NW 53rd Avenue Intersection and item  $VIII_B$ . Plan East Gainesville Subcommittee. Commissioner Chestnut seconded; motion passed unanimously.

MOTION: Commissioner Hutchinson moved to approve the Consent Agenda and Meeting Agenda amended to add items VII<sub>B</sub>. NW 43rd Street and NW 53rd Avenue Intersection and VIII<sub>B</sub>. Plan East Gainesville Subcommittee. Commissioner Chestnut seconded; motion passed unanimously.

## II. KERMIT SIGMON AWARD

Mr. Koons stated that Marlie Sanderson was selected by the Citizens Advisory Committee to receive the 2015 Dr. Kermit Sigmon Citizen Participation Award.

Mr. Sanderson discussed Kermit Sigmon's service to the community on transportation-related issues and thanked the Citizens Advisory Committee and Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the award.

Chair Warren presented the award to Mr. Sanderson.

#### III. CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE- VACANT POSITION

Mr. Koons stated that the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization needs to fill one vacant position on its Citizens Advisory Committee due to a resignation. He noted that the vacant position has a term of office through December 31, 2016. He said that there was one applicant for the vacant position.

MOTION: Commissioner Byerly moved to appoint John Pickett to the Citizens Advisory Committee for a term through December 31, 2016. Commissioner Budd seconded; motion passed unanimously.

## IV. TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Mr. Koons stated that the Transportation Improvement Program is the most important document that is approved each year by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization. He said that the Transportation Improvement Program is a staged implementation program of transportation projects consistent, to the maximum extent feasible, with adopted comprehensive plans of Alachua County and the City of Gainesville. He added that, in order for Federal transportation funds to be spent in the Gainesville Metropolitan Area, they must be approved by the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization and included in this report. He noted and answered questions regarding the following significant Fiscal Year 2016-17 projects:

- Airport Airfield Lighting/Signage;
- Bicycle/Pedestrian SW 27th Street Sidewalk and NW 19th Lane Bikelane/Sidewalk;
- Intersection Newberry Road Turnlanes;
- Interstate Rest Area Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning;
- Maintenance Lighting Agreement Countywide;
- Public Transportation Regional Transit System Capital/Operations and Capital funding;
- Resurfacing State Road 121 Resurfacing Projects from U.S. 441 (NW 13th Street) to La Crosse and State Road 24 (Archer Road) to NW 5th Avenue; and
- Road Construction SW 40th Boulevard Extension Project between State Road 24 (Archer Road) and State Road 121 (SW 34th Street).

A member asked about transit funding.

A member requested that the Archer Road projects adjacent to the University of Florida be coordinated among the City of Gainesville, Florida Department of Transportation and the university of Florida.

Karen Taulbee, Florida Department of Transportation District 2 Planning Manager, discussed the allocation of funding for transit.

Teresa Scott, Gainesville Public Works Director, stated that Alachua County receives credit for the transit allocation and that she can provide this information to the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization.

## **MOTION:** Commissioner Pinkoson moved to:

1. approve the Fiscal Years 2016-17 to 2020-21 Transportation Improvement Program as modified to address review agency comments: and

- 2. request that the Florida Department of Transportation, City of Gainesville and the University of Florida coordinate the implementation of the following projects:
  - U.S. 441(SW 13th Street) at Archer Road Traffic Signal Update (4358911);
  - State Road 24 (Archer Road) Landscaping Project (4359291); and
  - State Road 24 (Archer Road) Campus Development Agreement-funded modifications.

Commissioner Budd seconded. Mr. Koons conducted a show-of-hands vote; motion passed unanimously.

## V. LIST OF PRIORITY PROJECTS

Mr. Koons stated that, each year, priorities for unfunded projects are submitted to the Florida Department of Transportation. He said that these priorities are used by the Department to develop its Tentative Work Program. He added that the draft List of Priority Projects for this year includes projects from the adopted Year 2040 Long-Range Transportation Plan and from local agency recommendations. He noted that the State Road 222 (NW 39th Avenue) at NW 83rd Street intersection safety project priority is in Appendix D.

Jeff Hays, Alachua County Transportation Planning Manager, discussed the SE 43rd Street Safe Routes to School project. He noted that the project is to complete the gaps in the sidewalk within the corridor.

MOTION: Commissioner Hayes-Santos moved to approve the List of Priority Projects.

Commissioner Byerly seconded; motion passed unanimously.

# VI. PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT PLAN UPDATE

Mr. Koons stated that the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization is required to review its Public Involvement Plan and revise it as needed. He discussed the revisions that were made to the plan this year and answered questions. He noted that a 45-day legal notice was published in local newspapers inviting the public to attend the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization meeting to provide comments on the proposed revisions.

MOTION: Commissioner Pinkoson moved to approve the Public Involvement Plan update; Commissioner Budd seconded; motion passed unanimously.

# VII. CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE ROLE TO ALACHUA COUNTY AND THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE

Mr. Koons stated that in the past, the Citizens Advisory Committee advised the Alachua County Board of County Commissioners and the City of Gainesville City Commission concerning local transportation issues.

Rob Brinkman, Citizens Advisory Committee Chair, spoke regarding the Citizens Advisory Committee historic advisory role to Alachua County and the City of Gainesville.

MOTION: Commissioner Pinkoson moved to approve a motion to advise the Alachua County Board of County Commissioners and the City of Gainesville City Commission that as in the past, the Citizens Advisory Committee is willing to act again as their citizens advisory committee on matters concerning local transportation issues and to refer this matter to Alachua County staff and the Alachua County Attorney and the City of Gainesville staff and the City of Gainesville Attorney. Commissioner Budd seconded; motion passed unanimously.

# VII<sub>B</sub>. NW 43RD STREET AT NW 53RD AVENUE INTERSECTION

A member discussed concerns regarding a City of Gainesville Plan Board approval of a redevelopment project in the northwest quadrant of the NW 43rd Street at NW 53rd Avenue intersection which are both Alachua County-maintained roads.

Ms. Scott stated that the applicant for the project had completed a traffic impact analysis and that the project required an Alachua County access permit. She noted that Alachua County has not issued any permits at this time.

Paula Guerrein discussed concerns regarding traffic safety and the drive-thru traffic ingress/egress.

Mark Spiller discussed safety concerns regarding cyclists and school children.

#### VIII. INTERSTATE 75 RELIEF TASK FORCE

Mr. Koons stated that Florida Department of Transportation Central Office staff was present to discuss the Interstate 75 Relief Task Force activity.

Huiwei Shen, Systems Planning Manager, made a presentation and discussed the Interstate 75 Relief Task Force activity and answered questions.

Kayla Sosnow asked whether electronic comments placed on the Interstate 75 Relief Facebook page were included as part of the official public comment on the project.

Ms. Shen discussed the Interstate 75 Relief Task Force consensus recommendations and issues that still need resolution. She said that clarification on the issues will be discussed at the Interstate 75 Relief Task Force August 12, 2016 meeting. She added that she received the petition and the comments on Facebook were not addressed to the Department and are not included in the public comment record.

Chandler Otis discussed concerns and opportunities regarding the Interstate 75 Relief project.

Judy Edsner discussed agricultural and aquifer recharge area concerns regarding the Interstate 75 Relief project.

MOTION: Commissioner Byerly moved to authorize the Chair to sign a letter to the Interstate 75 Relief Task Force with a recommendation that the Interstate 75 Relief Task Force include in its report to the Florida Department of Transportation:

1. recommendations that are consistent with the Alachua County and City of Gainesville comprehensive plans and the Year 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan; and

2. a recommendation to amend state statutes to enable the Florida Department of Transportation to allocate State Highway System/Strategic Intermodal System funds to projects on local-maintained facilities that provide congestion relief to adjacent State Highway System/Strategic Intermodal System facilities.

Commissioner Hutchinson seconded; motion passed unanimously.

# VIIIB. PLAN EAST GAINESVILLE SUBCOMMITTEE

Mr. Koons reported that the Plan East Gainesville Subcommittee will sunset after one more meeting. He noted that there was one vacancy on the Subcommittee representing the City of Gainesville.

MOTION: Commissioner Budd moved to appoint Mayor Poe to the Plan East Gainesville Subcommittee. Commissioner Chase seconded; motion passed unanimously.

# IX. NEXT METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION MEETING

Mr. Koons announced that the next Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization meeting is scheduled for August 1, 2016 at 3:00 p.m. He added that the Plan East Gainesville Subcommittee is scheduled to also meet on August 1, 2016 at 4:00 p.m.

# RESOLUTION NO. 2016-05

A RESOLUTION OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR THE GAINESVILLE URBANIZED AREA AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO AMEND SUPPLEMENTAL JOINT PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT NUMBER 3 BETWEEN THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION AND TRANSPORTATION **PLANNING** METROPOLITAN THE ORGANIZATION FOR THE GAINESVILLE URBANIZED AREA 2015-16 **FEDERAL** TRANSIT REGARDING FISCAL YEAR ADMINISTRATION SECTION 5305(d) PUBLIC TRANSIT OFFICE PLANNING FUNDS IN ALACHUA COUNTY, FLORIDA; TO PROVIDE AN EXTENSION OF TIME TO DECEMBER 31, 2016.

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area has applied for and received Fiscal Year 2015-16 Federal Transit Administration Section 5305(d) Public Transit Office planning funds in Alachua County in order to examine transportation system management and transportation demand management techniques which are designed to improve the transportation system through low-cost measures to reduce traffic congestion and obtain greater capacity out of the existing highway system;

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation and the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area executed a Joint Participation Agreement AQR 23 in order to be able to expend Fiscal Year 2015-16 Federal Transit Administration Section 5305(d) Public Transit Office planning funds in Alachua County;

WHEREAS, the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area has the authority to request an extension of time for said Joint Participation Agreement and to undertake the project hereinafter described, as authorized under Section 339.175(10)(b), Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, an extension of time for said Joint Participation Agreement will enable the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area to prepare these studies and then seek reimbursement of funds from the Florida Department of Transportation.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION FOR THE GAINESVILLE URBANIZED AREA:

- 1. That the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area has the authority to request an extension of time for said the Joint Participation Agreement.
- 2. That the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area authorizes its Executive Director to execute an extension of time request for said Joint Participation Agreement on behalf of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area will enable the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area to undertake planning to facilitate Public Transit Office planning activities in Alachua County, Florida.

- 3. That the total project cost remains unchanged at two hundred and four thousand eight hundred and thirty dollars and no cents (\$204,830.00) which represents one hundred sixty-three thousand eight hundred and sixty-four dollars and no cents (\$163,864.00) federal funds (at 80 percent), twenty thousand four hundred and eighty-three dollars and no cents (\$20,483.00) state funds (at 10 percent) and twenty thousand four hundred and eighty-three dollars and no cents (\$20,483.00) local funds (at 10 percent).
- 4. That the amount of reimbursement is not to exceed one hundred and eighty-four thousand three hundred and forty-seven dollars and no cents (\$184,347.00) which represents the federal and state portion of the project cost.
- 5. That the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area authorizes its Executive Director to act in connection with the request for an extension of time for said Joint Participation Agreement to provide such additional information as may be required by the Florida Department of Transportation.
- 6. That the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area authorizes its Executive Director to sign any and all reimbursement invoices and warranties that may be required in connection with the Joint Participation Agreement or subsequent Supplemental Joint Participation Agreements.

7. That this resolution shall take effect upon its adoption.

Dear Ms. Warren.

The Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area (MTPO) has recently asked several questions of the Department, either in MTPO meetings, or in correspondence. Below are responses to these recent questions.

1. The MTPO requested the SR 121 (NW 34<sup>th</sup> Street) Safety Project (turn lanes) be presented on a single map, rather than a series of sheets.

To see the detail of urban projects, the scale needs to be 1'' = 50 feet. The project is 3.7 miles long; therefore, a single sheet would need to be 32 feet long. This length is not practical.

2. What is the speed limit on northbound SR 121 approaching the hill?

**45 MPH** 

3. Can a Variable Speed Limit sign be installed approaching the hill that would lower the speed limit when there is congestion?

Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Traffic Operations has studied the situation and is recommending flashing warning signs that would be activated when they detect excessive northbound queuing at the intersection of SR 121 (SW 34<sup>th</sup> Street) and SR 26A (SW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue). The new signs should be installed by mid-August (before school starts). These will not change the speed limit, but will warn traffic approaching the hill when the queue is approaching the other side of the hill.

4. Can lane designation markings be added approaching the hill, to allow motorists to get into the proper lane earlier? Last minute lane changing likely contributes to crashes.

FDOT Traffic Operations will evaluate the possibility of including lane designation pavement markings with the proposed intersection project: 439488-1 – SR 121 (SW34th St from SR 26A (SE 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave) to SR 26 (W Univ. Ave). FDOT Traffic Operations is requesting Design funding for FY2017/18 (begins July 1, 2017) and Construction funding for FY2019/20.

5. Northeast 39<sup>th</sup> Avenue (SR 222) Crosswalk – there was a request for the pedestrian counts and the associated warrants for a crosswalk.

### Warrants:

- 20 or more pedestrians during a single hour (any four consecutive 15- minute periods) of an average day, or
- 18 or more pedestrians during each of any two hours of an average day, or
- 15 or more pedestrians during each of any three hours of an average day

Counts were conducted March 15 (Tuesday) through March 17 (Thursday), 2016:

As shown in this table, none of the warrants for a pedestrian crossing are met at this location.

6. Waldo Road (SR 24) – what is the cost and funding source for the recommended lighting project?

The estimate of the project cost is \$2.6 million. The likely funding source is Federal Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSP). FDOT Traffic Operations is requesting Design funding for FY2017/18 and Construction funding for FY2019/20.

The goal of SRTS program is to get more students walking and bicycling where it is safe and to fix the conditions where it is not safe. The opportunity to bike and walk to school offers a solution to an array of concerns about traffic safety, traffic congestion, transportation costs and lack of physical activity. At the same times, walking and bicycling to school provides an opportunity for students to build independence. Our goal is based on making that solution into a reality.

## **Call for Applications**

December 1, 2015 opened the call for applications for Safe Routes to School Applications in Florida.

Next call will begin November 2016

Florida is seeking applications to plan, develop, implement and evaluate eligible Safe Routes to School (SRTS) infrastructure projects. The application is available at the following link.

Eligible recipients of these funds for SRTS projects are limited to state, local and regional transportation maintaining agencies, including schools and school districts. Schools and School Districts will need to collaborate with a maintaining agency to complete the projects. Applications are accepted only from these entities. Recipients of SRTS funds will be responsible for all aspects of project implementation.

Eligible SRTS projects shall directly support increased safety and convenience for students in grades K-high school to walk and/or bicycle to/from school. In addition, all projects that use SRTS funds shall comply with applicable federal, state and local provisions.

## **Program Highlights**

While we emulated FHWA's SRTS Program, we made some changes to fit the needs of Florida schools.

- The most important change is that this is Florida's SRTS Program.
- High Schools are now eligible.
- We are not offering non-infrastructure funds. Instead, we are conducting a statewide training program to conclude in 3 years. After this, all funds will be used for infrastructure projects only. See next page for more information.

Florida SRTS Program is 100% funded and is managed through the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) on a cost reimbursement basis. Applications are submitted to the local FDOT District Safe Routes to School Coordinator. They can assist with applications and answer questions.

The following measures are critical:

- Infrastructure projects are awarded through a competitive process at the local FDOT level.
- Applications are reviewed at the District level for compliance with SRTS Guidelines.
- Applicants are encouraged to be as cost effective as possible so that more projects can be funded.
- Applicants must prioritize their requests and apply for no more than five projects during each Call for Applications.
- The Guidelines list examples of both eligible and ineligible projects. Always check for the most recent version and they do evolve over time.

Beginning 2017, Florida set aside \$7 million a year for 10 years. In order to accommodate needed funds for projects in 2016, \$2 million was advanced leaving \$5 million for 2017.



While we are fortunate to have this set aside funding, this will not cover all of the needs. With this in mind, remember Safe Routes to School Projects are also eligible for SR2T, CMAQ, STP, or transportation alternatives funding.

#### RECOMMENDATION

#### **BACKGROUND**

The 2016 Florida Legislature authorized \$1,750,000 of non-recurring funds to be competitively awarded by the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged through a Mobility Enhancement Grant Program. The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged was directed to award grant funds to Community Transportation Coordinators to support projects that:

- 1) enhance the access of older adults, persons with disabilities, and low income individuals to healthcare, shopping, education, employment, public services, and recreation;
- 2) assist in the development, improvement, and use of transportation systems in non-urbanized areas;
- 3) promote the efficient coordination of services;
- 4) support inter-city bus transportation; or
- 5) encourage private transportation provider participation.

MV Transportation, Inc., the Community Transportation Coordinator for Alachua County, was one of five applicants to be awarded Mobility Enhancement Grant funds from the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged. MV Transportation, Inc. was awarded \$49,815 to provide reduced fare bus passes to the homeless.

MV Transportation, Inc. will partner with GRACE Martketplace and the City of Gainesville to provide 31-day reduced fare bus passes to the homeless population residing in Gainesville. MV Transportation, Inc. estimates the Mobility Enhancement Grant funds will provide 225 reduced fare bus passes each month. This project was funded for a one-year period.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Florida Department of Transportation is requesting that the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization amend its Transportation Improvement Program to roll forward funding from Fiscal Year 2015-16 to Fiscal Year 2016-17 for the projects shown in Exhibit 1. This amendment is needed because these projects were not committed by June 30, 2016 - the end of the state fiscal year.

Each year, funds for some federally-funded projects are rolled forward into the next fiscal year because of the difference between the federal and state fiscal years. The federal fiscal year is from October 1st to September 30th each year, while the state fiscal year is from July 1st to June 30th.
