IV. FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TENTATIVE FIVE YEAR WORK PROGRAM

Mr. Marlie Sanderson, Director of Transportation Planning, stated that each year the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) submits its Tentative Five Year Work Program for review by the MTPO. He and Ms. Karen Taulbee, FDOT Transportation Specialist, discussed the Tentative Five Year Work Program and answered questions. They also discussed funding to study the Multimodal Emphasis Corridors.

Ms. Linda Dixon, University of Florida Facilities Planning Assistant Director, noted that the University has 90 percent plans for extending SW 23rd Terrace up to Hull Road and requested that the scoping of traffic signal updates be aware of this project.

MOTION: Debbie Leistner moved to recommend that the MTPO send a letter to request that the Florida Department of Transportation fund the number two priority in the long range transportation plan on the State Highway System- State Road 121 (NW 34th Street) turnlanes for location where they are needed, such as NW 23 Terrace, NW 25 Terrace and the entrance to Rock Creek subdivision. Jesus Gomez seconded; motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Taulbee noted that the District would host a public workshop on December 5, 2013 and a public hearing on December 9, 2013.

V. TOP TEN NEEDED BUS PULLOUT LOCATIONS

Mr. Sanderson stated that the MTPO referred development of a top ten list of bus pullout locations. He discussed the new locations proposed by the Regional Transit System and answered questions. he suggested adding the list to the List of Priority Projects appendix.

MOTION: Linda Dixon moved to recommend that the MTPO approve the top ten bus pullout locations shown in Exhibit 1 and include the list in the List of Priority Projects appendix. Ron Fuller seconded; motion passed unanimously.

VI. UNMARKED PEDESTRIAN CROSSWALKS

Mr. Sanderson stated that the MTPO requested development of recommendations for locations of marked midblock pedestrian crosswalks. He discussed a draft list of locations provided by City of Gainesville Public Works and University of Florida Facilities Planning staffs and answered questions.

Mr. Brian Singleton, Alachua County Traffic Engineer, discussed the need for pedestrian crossing studies.

VII. PEDESTRIAN SAFETY AT SW 34TH STREET LOCATIONS

Mr. Sanderson stated that the MTPO discussed safety concerns at the SW 34th Street intersections at Archer Road and Windmeadows Boulevard at its August meeting and referred this issue to the Alachua County Community Traffic Safety Team. The Safety Team did not provide any recommendations. He asked the TAC to develop a recommendation for making these intersections less hostile to pedestrians.

VIII. SOCIOECONOMIC VARIABLES- BASE YEAR 2010 AND FUTURE YEAR 2040

Mr. Sanderson discussed the status of the socioeconomic variables for the Year 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan update and answered questions.

XII. INFORMATION ITEMS

Mr. Dean Mimms, City of Gainesville lead Planner, announced a lecture by Victor Dover.

Ms. Taulbee announced that this was her last meeting as a TAC member and that she would be the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization liaison.

Notes:

(A) Based on the combined score, stop 255 was identified as the 30th priority for a bus bay improvement. This stop, however, serves as the end of the line (EOL) for the route 15, Therefore, it has a longer than average dwell time which it has to accommodate by parking in an adjacent private lot; without fundamentally altering the route's pattern there are currently no other EOL options. For this reason, RTS Operations staff requested that this stop should be made the top priority for improvement. Other modifications to the top 10 list include the elimination of stop 139 (potential environmental conflicts), the elimination of stops 46, 849, and 797 (feasibility issues identified by the University of Florida), the elimination of stop 37 (reentry into traffic issues), and the elimination of stop 1216 (lack of land area).

Moreover, since the data was not randomly missing and there was a categorical difference between those locations that had information and those that did not, techniques to estimate missing values, like mean imputation or multiple imputation would not be appropriate.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approve the revised format and also approve the draft priorities incorporating Exhibit 1- Table 2 Transportation Alternatives Program Priorities.

BACKGROUND

In June, the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area will be asked to approve transportation priorities for federal and state-funded projects. These priorities are forwarded to the Florida Department of Transportation and used to develop its Tentative Work Program. Please note that this year's List of Priority Project categories have been revised by moving several categories (that are from the adopted long range transportation plan) from the main body of the report to the Appendix. This includes the following:

- 1. Intelligent Transportation System;
- 2. State Highway System (portion of the "Capacity" category);
- 3. Strategic Intermodal System; and
- 4. Surface Transportation Program.

The benefit of moving this information to the Appendix is to separate the draft priorities, that can only be revised after holding a public hearing on proposed amendments to the long range transportation plan, from other priorities that are not addressed in the long range transportation plan. In addition, we have worked with Florida Department of Transportation District 2 staff to identify which categories need to be included. Please note that several categories from last year's report have been deleted, such as traffic operations, transportation disadvantaged and safety. Also please note that the Appendix C pages in yellow show the Year 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan project priorities. Below is the link to the draft List of Priority Projects.
