CALL TO ORDER

Chair Jan Frentzen called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

I. INTRODUCTIONS

Chair Frentzen introduced himself and asked others to introduce themselves.

II. APPROVAL OF THE MEETING AGENDA

Chair Frentzen asked for approval of the meeting agenda.

Mr. Marlie Sanderson, MTPO Director of Transportation Planning, suggested placing agenda item VI. Long Range Transportation plan Update- Testing and Evaluation of Alternatives after agenda item VIII. Proposed NE 8th Avenue Mast Arm- Vertical Signal Heads.

ACTION: Rob Brinkman moved to approve the meeting agenda amended to place agenda Item VI. Long Range Transportation Plan Update-Testing and Evaluation of Alternatives after agenda item VIII. Proposed NE 8th Avenue Mast Arm-Vertical Signal Heads. James Samec seconded; motion passed unanimously.

III. APPROVAL OF COMMITTEE MINUTES

Chair Frentzen asked for approval of the CAC meeting minutes.

ACTION: Rob Brinkman moved to approve the April 21, 2010 CAC minutes. Nelle Bullock seconded; motion passed unanimously.

IV. UPCOMING MEETINGS

Mr. Sanderson announced that the next MTPO meeting is scheduled for June 14th at 1:00 p.m. in the Jack Durrance Auditorium. He said that the CAC's next meeting, if needed, is scheduled for July 12th.

V. TRANSPORTATON IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AMENDMENTS-BUS RAPID TRANSIT (BRT) ALTERNATIVE ANALYSIS

Mr. Sanderson stated that the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has provided \$125,000 towards funding a Bus Rapid Transit Alternative Analysis Study. He noted that this study was necessary in order for the Regional Transit System (RTS) to apply for Federal Transit Administration grants for BRT. He said that the <u>TIP</u> needs to be amended in order for RTS to receive this funding.

ACTION: James Samec moved to recommend that the MTPO amend the Fiscal Years 2012009/2010 – 3/2014 TIP and Fiscal Years 2010/2011 – 2014/2015 TIP to add the Bus Rapid Transit Alternative Analysis project (4285911). Ruth Steiner seconded; motion passed unanimously.

VII. STATE ROAD 20 LANDSCAPING

Mr. Sanderson stated that FDOT staff has identified funds that can be used to landscape Hawthorne Road (State Road 20). He noted that this project was the third-ranked priority in 2009. He added that this project is the sixth-ranked priority in the recently approved List of Priority Projects. He suggested that the MTPO send a letter of support for the project to FDOT.

ACTION: Ruth Steiner moved to recommend that the MTPO send a letter of support for the State Road 20 Landscaping project. James Samec seconded; motion passed unanimously.

VIII. PROPOSED NE 8TH AVENUE MAST ARM- VERTICAL SIGNAL HEADS

Mr. Sanderson stated that the City of Gainesville has requested an exception to the MTPO's horizontal signal head policy for the traffic signal at the NW 8th Avenue and NW 18th Terrace intersection. He noted that the MTPO considers exceptions on a case-by-case basis.

Mr. Jerry Dabkowski, Volkert Vice President, discussed the NW 8th Avenue at NW 18th Terrace intersection traffic signal update project and answered questions.

ACTION: Harvey Budd moved to recommend that the MTPO allow an exception to the horizontal signal head policy for the NW 8th Avenue at NW 18th Terrace Traffic Signal Project. Ruth Steiner seconded; motion passed unanimously.

VI. LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATON PLAN UPDATE-TESTING AND EVALUATION OF ALTERNATIVES

Mr. Sanderson stated that the testing and analyses of Alternative 1- Transit/BRT Emphasis, Alternative 2- Highway Emphasis and Alternative 3 Transit/Streetcar Emphasis are completed. He said that the MTPO's consultant would discuss the results.

Mr. Whit Blanton, Renaissance Planning Group Vice President, discussed the results of the testing and evaluation of the alternatives and answered questions. He also reported the results of the peak oil scenarios. He discussed and recommended an Alternative 4 Hybrid Needs Network for testing and evaluation.

ACTION: Ruth Steiner moved to recommend that the MTPO approve Joint Technical Advisory Committee-MTPO Staff Alternative 4 recommendation amended to add a Bus Rapid Transit route from Santa Fe College to the University of Florida campus for via NW 23rd Avenue to NW 43rd Street to Newberry Road testing and evaluation. Rob Brinkman seconded; motion passed unanimously.

X. CAC- REQUEST TO BE A CITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Mr. Sanderson stated that the CAC, at its April meeting, discussed restoring its status as an advisory committee to the City of Gainesville.

Chair Frentzen discussed a draft letter to the MTPO that requests that the MTPO send a letter to the Mayor of Gainesville requesting that the City Commission reconsider having the Citizens Advisory Committee as an advisory committee to the City of Gainesville on transportation issues and answered questions.

ACTION: Rob Brinkman moved to authorize the CAC Chair to send a letter, revised to note that the Bicycle/Pedestrian Advisory Board advises the City of Gainesville, to the MTPO that recommends that the MTPO send a letter to the Mayor of Gainesville requesting that the City Commission reconsider having the Citizens Advisory Committee as an advisory committee to the City of Gainesville on transportation issues (see Exhibit 1). Nelle Bullock seconded; motion passed unanimously.




Gainesville Livable Community Reinvestment Plan: Network Alternatives Evaluation









ATTENDANCE RULE

Any appointee of the MTPO to the CAC shall be automatically removed from the committee upon filing with the Chairman of the MTPO appropriate proof that such person has had three (3) or more consecutive unexcused absences, or that the overall attendance record of any such person (including excused and unexcused absences) is less than 66-2/3% for any six (6) month consecutive period or less than 66-2/3% for six (6) consecutive meetings if meetings are not held each month, whichever is longer. Excused absences are here defined to be those absences which occur from regular or special meetings after notification by such person to the Chairman prior to such absence explaining the reasons therefore. All other absences are here defined to be unexcused.

ADDITIONAL NOTES:

- 1. On October 30, 1985, staff asked the CAC to clarify the procedures staff should use to record attendance at CAC meetings. The CAC instructed staff to use the following procedures:
 - A. all CAC meetings will require mandatory attendance by all members; and
 - B. attendance is recorded at all CAC meetings, even if a quorum is not present.
- 2. On April 28, 1999, the CAC decided to limit attendance by teleconferencing to medical emergencies only.

District Two Environmental Management Office, specifically the District Landscape Architect, has identified a project to be funded under a District-wide landscape contract in the MTPO boundary.

In 2006, the MTPO added a project on SR 26/E University Ave, to its List of Priority Projects, number 1. During the next work program cycle, funding was provided as a stand- alone landscape project in the 2009/10 Adopted Work Program (project #2075803) to begin in FY 2012. Subsequently, due to funding shortages, this project was deleted from the work program.

District Two has established a district-wide push button landscape contract, approved this fiscal year, 2010/2011. The push button contract lists several district wide landscape projects in multiple counties, and will be initiated one work order at a time, as funding allows.

The first project authorized under the new contract is for median trees (112 Chinese Elms, 30 gal. size) to be planted, watered, and established in accordance with the specifications of the contract, along SR 26/E. University Avenue, from SE 15th St. to CR 329B.

The second project authorized under the new contract will be a requested project in Waldo, along US 301 in Alachua County. We appreciate Ken Cheek, the District Landscape Architect reviving the funding for these projects in Gainesville and Alachua County.
