CALL TO ORDER

Chair Mike Byerly called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m.

I. APPROVAL OF THE MEETING AGENDA AND CONSENT AGENDA

Mr. Marlie Sanderson, Director of Transportation Planning for the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area, recommended approval of the consent agenda and meeting agenda. A member requested one revision to place Consent Agenda Item 7, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21), on the meeting agenda after Agenda item III, Transportation Mode Funding.

MOTION: Commissioner Hawkins moved to approve the Consent Agenda and Meeting Agenda amended to place Consent Agenda item 7, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21), on the meeting agenda to new Agenda item III_B, Transportation Mode Funding. Commissioner Bottcher seconded; motion passed unanimously.

II. FISCAL YEARS 2013 - 2017 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM-ROLL FORWARD AMENDMENTS

Mr. Sanderson stated that the Florida Department of Transportation has requested several amendments to the Fiscal Years 2012-13 to 2016-17 Transportation Improvement Program to roll forward to Fiscal Year 2012-13 the projects shown in Exhibit 1.

MOTION: Commissioner Pinkoson moved to amend the Fiscal Years 2012-13 to 2016-17 Transportation Improvement Program to roll forward to Fiscal Year 2012-13 the projects shown in Exhibit 1. Commissioner Hawkins seconded. Chair Byerly conducted a show-of-hands vote; motion passed unanimously.

III. TRANSPORTATION MODE FUNDING

Mr. Sanderson stated that, at its June meeting, the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area requested that the Florida Department of Transportation provide a 5-to-10 year listing of projects, by funding source, in order to compare transportation mode funding levels for currently funded projects and also for future projects.

Mr. James Bennett, Florida Department of Transportation District 2 Urban Transportation Engineer, and Ms. Karen Taulbee, Florida Department of Transportation District 2 Transportation Specialist, discussed funding sources and the transportation funding process.

III_B. MOVING AHEAD FOR PROGRESS IN THE 21ST CENTURY (MAP-21)

Mr. Sanderson and Mr. Bennett discussed recently enacted federal transportation legislation entitled "Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP 21)" and answered questions. A member raised questions regarding the amount of funding allocated by the legislation to Florida and to Alachua County, when local governments will receive funds, how the funds will be dispersed and how local governments will be able to spend the funds. Mr. Bennett stated that he will not be able to answer these questions by the next meeting. Mr. Sanderson stated that he will try and provide the requested information for either the October or December meeting.

It was agreed that if members have specific questions regarding the legislation they should email them to Mr. Sanderson.

IV. NEXT MEETING

Mr. Sanderson announced that the next Metropolitan Transportation Planning Organization for the Gainesville Urbanized Area meeting is scheduled for October 1st at 3:00 p.m.

V. COMMENTS

Commissioner DeLaney stated that she recently attended a training session sponsored by the Florida Metropolitan Organization Advisory Council regarding their recently-completed Transportation Revenue Study.
